

Program Description

Hawaii's Road Usage Charge (RUC) for electric vehicles (EVs) will take effect on July 1, 2025. At that time, EV drivers can opt to pay the per-mile RUC, which is less than a penny per mile, or a flat annual RUC of \$50. By the end of 2025, the Hawaii Department of Transportation will prepare and submit a plan to the legislature to transition all light-duty vehicles to the RUC system by 2033.

Hawaii conducted a two-part test pilot prior to planning the implementation of their RUC program. Starting in 2018, the first part sent mock driving reports to 360,000 vehicle owners and collected over 40,000 survey responses. The second part, the Technology Test Drive, involved 1,887 volunteers testing automated mileage reporting, including a fleet demonstration with 242 vehicles.





Mileage Reporting Options


Odometer reading captured at annual vehicle safety inspection (miles calculated and RUC assessed at registration renewal)

Vehicle Types

- July 1, 2025 June 30, 2028: Electric vehicles subject to per-mile or flat annual RUC (capped at \$50)
- July 1, 2028: Mandatory per-mile RUC for all EVs
